

Among these were a number of new faces. Star-forward Essa Gaye returned this year with a former team-mate of his from Africa. Sulyman Njie contributed tremendous speed and agility which allowed him many opportunities. Freshman Bryan Wheeler added another scoring threat with his powerful foot.

Coach Horwood added that "we just had a lot of team depth this season. We never felt that we were hurting when we did substitute. These guys really worked with and for each other." That same type of team-work will be instrumental as the Crusaders make plans to unseat district powers next season and make their first appearance in nationals.

Nine of the fifteen members on the team were Freshmen. This meant a younger team, but also a building block for the future.






United Spirit Overthrows BSU.

























A theme that united the team

Working with a fairly young team, only one Senior, Coach Hopkins molded a fine tuned squad that turned in a 19-9 win/loss talley for overall season play.


Peggy Hoover sparked the offense as she lead the team with total points and dished out a num-

The team looks forward to the following season and will lose only one player with graduation. With the experience gained this season they should return stronger than ever to defend their conference title.



Gaining the needed experience to someday make the jump to the Varsity team, this years' J.V.ers sharpened their skills and maneuvers.






















"Give Me A 'C'

All in all, the squad experienced a very successful season. With devoted fans behind them and a talented team in front the squad delighted in asking the crowded gym "Give me a C..."




Long before Homecoming, a select group of men began the grueling task of preparing their bodies for one of the most demanding sports ever concieved.

While these records stand for the duration of the off season, the girls again will prepare to set up new records in the upcoming season.































Thin clads boast




'80 Baseball Squad




Experience proved to be the true success of this years squad. Their traveling to various matches against large Universities conditioned them for conference competition on a higher level.

































Different Classes create variety of lifestyles!


Often used sarcastically, this





Junior class surpasses financial woes.




Experience #346A Jogging





Experience #242 The 6:00 a.m. shower line






Experience #140 Laying out.




Experience #144 Laying-out Chapman Style.
